The Upper West Side features two separate subway lines and multiple bus routes, providing ease of access to all that Manhattan has to offer.


The 1, 2, 3 Red Subway line runs along Broadway with local and express service to get you anywhere in Manhattan in a hurry.



The 4,5,6 Green Subway line runs along Lexington Avenue with local and express service to get you anywhere in Manhattan in a hurry.

The Q line runs along Second Avenue, and connects with all other major subway lines in New York.

There are three cross town bus lines that connect the Upper East Side to the Upper West Side through Central Park.

One of the most sought-after neighborhoods in New York City, Midtown is bound by the East River to the east and the Hudson River to the west. It has everything you need right at your doorstep, and is convenient to all transportation, so you can get to most places in Manhattan in under 30 minutes. As the central portion within the borough of Manhattan, Midtown is home to some of the city's most luxurious real estate.

Midtown is the largest commercial, entertainment, and media center in the United States, and hosts some of New York City's tallest hotels and skyscrapers. Times Square and the Broadway / Theatre District are major centers of the world's entertainment industry, and Sixth Avenue holds the headquarters of three of the four major U.S. television networks. Whether you want to see a Broadway show, have a picnic in Central Park, or hit the books at the New York Public Library, Midtown offers you convenient access to everything the City has to provide.


TRANSPORTATION

All major railroads are conveniently located in Midtown, including Penn Station, Grand Central Station, and Port Authority Bus Terminal, allowing for interstate transportation if you ever feel like taking a weekend trip out of New York.

Both the east and west side of Midtown also offer convenient access to all subway and bus lines, allowing you to travel throughout Manhattan and the surrounding boroughs with ease. These include: 1/2/3, 4/5/6, 7, A/C/E, B/D/F/M, N/Q/R, L, S.

Downtown Manhattan, denoted as 14th Street and below, is bordered by the Hudson River on the west, the East River on the east and the New York Harbor on the south. Prominent neighborhoods within Downtown include the Lower East Side, the East Village, and the West Village.

The eclectic Lower East Side is where longstanding New York buildings mix with upscale apartments and chic boutiques. Nighttime draws hip crowds to the area's trendy bars, music venues and restaurants.

The East Village is also known for its happening nightlife; old-school bars, music venues and performance spaces share the streets with trendy cocktail lounges and restaurants. Daytime sees a more laid-back crowd browsing boutiques, vintage shops and tattoo parlors, and dining at casual cafes.

The West Village draws fashionable crowds to its designer boutiques and chic restaurants. Quaint streets, some still cobblestoned, are lined with Federal-style townhouses and public squares. Notable venues include the Village Vanguard jazz club and the Stonewall Inn bar, site of the 1969 riots that launched the gay rights movement. The historically arty area also has piano bars, cabarets and theaters.


